## A Synodal Church in Mission - A Synthesis Report of the 1st Session held from 4 to 29 Oct 2023

Our parish newsletter intends to publish weekly the document for us to be part of this process of becoming a synodal church.



Introduction: "For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body" (1 Cor 12:13) is the experience, full of joy and gratitude, that the Synodal members had in the First Session of the Synodal Assembly held from 4 to 29 October 2023 on the theme "For a Synodal Church. Communion, Participation, Mission". Despite their diversity of backgrounds, languages and cultures, through the common grace of Baptism they have been able to live those days together with one heart and spirit. The Holy Spirit gifted them with an experience of the harmony that God alone can generate; it is a gift and a witness in a world that is torn and divided.

The Assembly took place while wars both old and new have raged in the world, with dramatic

consequences that were impacting upon countless victims. The cry of those who are poor resounded among them, of those forced to migrate and of those suffering violence and the Exposition of The Blessed Sacrament devastating consequences of climate change. They heard their cry through the media, through the voices of many present, who were personally involved in those tragic events whether through their families or their people. The Assembly took this cry into their hearts and prayers, wondering how our Churches can foster paths of reconciliation, hope, justice and peace.

The meeting took place in Rome, gathered around the successor of Peter, who confirmed them in their faith and encouraged them to be audacious in the mission. The Assembly began with an ecumenical vigil, which saw the leaders and representatives of the other Churches and Christian communities praying together with the Pope at the tomb of Peter. Unity ferments silently within the Holy Church of God. "How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity" (Ps

At the behest of the Holy Father, the Assembly saw other members of the People of God gathered together and around the bishops. The bishops, united among themselves and with the Bishop of Rome, made manifest the Church as a communion of Churches. Lay people, those in consecrated life, deacons and priests were, together with the bishops, witnesses of a process that intends to involve the whole Church and everyone in the Church. Their presence reminded the members that the Assembly was not an isolated event, but an integral part and a necessary step in the synodal process. The multiplicity of interventions and the plurality of positions voiced in the Assembly revealed a Church that is learning to embrace a synodal style and is seeking the most suitable ways to make this happen.
