Know our Parishioners

Our Faith Journey Story - Faith Across Borders

We are Eva (10 years old) and Elaina (9 years old), and we are excited to share our Faith journey with you. We are the students at Holy Trinity Catholic School in Papakura, New Zealand. We are also members of St. Mary's Parish. Our spiritual path has also been shaped by the many places we have called home. We believe that you will find it inspiring and encouraging.

Our parents have been our greatest inspiration, guiding us with unwavering Faith and love. They were born and raised in India and have a strong Christian background. Our grandfather, who is 88 years old, dedicated 35 years of his life to teaching Catechism in his parish.

Eva was born and baptised in the UK, where her Faith walk began. Growing up there, our home was situated next to the church, making it convenient for our family to attend daily Holy Mass, especially during our mother's maternity leave. Even as a baby, Eva was exposed to the rhythms of prayer and worship, and over time, we both developed a deep connection to our Faith. During that time, while pregnant with Elaina, we believed that attending daily Holy Mass would bring abundant blessings to both Eva and the baby in Mom's womb.

In Ireland, we learned more about Christianity through school and community life. In Irish schools, religious education is taught through the "Grow in Love" programme, which provides a comprehensive understanding of Christian Faith to students. We have visited the Knock Shrine in County Mayo, Ireland, several times - a sacred site where, in 1879, fifteen villagers witnessed an apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, and St. John the Evangelist.

However, it was in India that our Faith deepened - attending parish activities, catechism classes, and hearing stories of Faith from our grandparents, who shared their wisdom and experiences. When Elaina and our little sister Elga were baptised in India, we were surprised to learn that, in accordance with the traditions of the Roman Catholic Church ,the sacrament of Confirmation is administered simultaneously with Baptism. In South India, we are fortunate to have numerous renowned pilgrimage centres. Whenever we travel, we make it a point to visit these sacred sites, enriching our understanding and connection to our Faith.

Moving to New Zealand brought an even stronger foundation. Studying in a Christian school, Faith is Exposition of The Blessed Sacrament now woven into our daily lives, not just in church but in every lesson and experience. We are currently preparing for our First Holy Communion and Reconciliation. We are impressed with how the classes are structured, offering separate sessions for each Sacrament, and providing opportunities for parents to learn alongside their children.

Each country has left a mark on our journey, but through it all, one thing remains constant - God's presence, guiding and strengthening us wherever they go. We believe that praying together as a family every evening strengthens our spiritual foundation. This practice fosters gratitude, enhances communication, and deepens our bond with each other and with God.
